SUBJECT: **DEFERRED COMPENSATION PLAN 457(b) featuring Roth – 2025 Annual Deferral Amounts**

The IRS has announced changes to the annual maximum deferral amounts for the Deferred Compensation 457(b) Plan for 2025. Deferral amounts are as follows:

Regular Maximum (age 49 and younger)Seas, 500.00

Minimum Bi-Weekly Amount (26 pay periods)
\$903.85

Catch-Up (age 50+) Minimum Bi-Weekly Amount (26 pay periods)

\$31,000.00 \$1,192.31

Catch-Up (age 60-63 only) Minimum Bi-Weekly Amount (26 pay periods)

\$34,750.00 \$1,336.54

3-Years Special Catch-Up * Minimum Bi-Weekly Amount (26 pay periods) \$47,000.00 To Be Determined, individually calculated.

Age 50+: If you become age 50 in any month of 2025, you may begin deferring the '50+ Catch-Up' amount beginning pay period 1 of January 2025.

Age 60-63: If you are or will become age 60-63 in any month of 2025, you may begin deferring the '60-63 Catch-Up' amount beginning pay period 1 of January 2025. However, if you are currently, or are turning 64 in any month of 2025, you must immediately discontinue the Age 60-63 catchup benefit, and you may return to the *Age 50*+ 'Catch-Up.'

Roth Feature: If you make Roth contributions before December 31, 2025, the 5 taxable-year period of participation will be counted as beginning on January 1, 2025.
